We'll find out -- on American Top 40.

2) AMERICA SINGS (:23)

Hi, this is Casey Kasem. Lately, the United States has become a popular subject for songwriters. Currently in the Top 40 we have "R.O.C.K. IN THE U.S.A."... "CALLING AMERICA"... and "LIVING IN AMERICA." And the official Billboard survey says that potential debuts include Jackson Browne's "FOR AMERICA" and Bob Seger's "AMERICAN STORM."
